CERTIFIED COPY OF A RESOLUTION DULY ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS FOR THE Courty of Craven at a special meeting held in the Craven Courty Hospital in the CITY OF NEW BERN. HORTH CAROLINA, TEESDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 1964

UNERRAS, the Episcopal Discess of Mastern Borth Carolina, because of their hysamitarian interest in the people, did out of their can resources and connections, some decades ago, build and equip a modern 60 bed hospital, in the City of New Barn, and have since operated same through the Good Shepherd Bospital Corporation, providing for the sick and afflicted over the years, under the

benign influences of the Church; and

WHEREAS, because of existing circumstances the said Diocese and the Board of Trustees of the Good Shephord Hospital Corporation have come to the conclusion that the financial burden involved in continuing to operate said Good Shepherd Mospital, is greater than this church organisation feels that it is in position to continue to bear; and

WHEREAS, by reason of said Siocese's and said Trustees' great and continuing interest in ministering to the sick and afflicted of this area, they have agreed to convey said Good Shephord Hospital property to Croven County, without cost to the County, to become a part and percel of the Craven County Mospital operating program, conditioned only upon its being used for hospital or kindred purposes. thus continuing the hospital ministrations begun several years ago by this fine benevolent group of church people;

MOS THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CONSIDERONERS OF CRAVEN COUNTY:

- 1. That we commend the Episcopal Diocese of Eastern North Carolina and the Board of Trustees of the Good Shapherd Hespital Corporation for the fine work they have done in the operation of Good Shepherd Hospital over the years, and for the humanitarian purposes fulfilled by caring for the sick and afflicted people of our community, through the ministrations of this splendid hospital unit,
- That we also commend the magnanizous spirit manifested on the part of the Diocese and the Good Shepherd Bospital Reard of Trustees, in offering to convey the Good Shepherd property and facilities to Craven County, without cost, thus augmenting the Craven County hospital facilities, and insuring a continuation of some 220 local hospital beds, which the indications are will continue to be needed, to serve the local hospital requirements.
- 3.
