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## DEATH OF JOHN C. GREEN

Passed Away This Morning at His Residence on Broad Street, in The 60th Year of His Age.

Died, this morning at 5 o'clock, at his residence on Broad street in the 60th year of his age, John Calhoun Green, a life-long resident of this city.

In the death of John C. Green, New Bern suffers a loss of one of its most popular, prominent, prosperous citizens, having for a number of years conducted a plumbing business in this city, and formerly manager of the New Bern Gas Company and master mechanic at the Atlantic and North Carolina Railroad shops. Mr. Green for several months had been in declining health and the fatal hour came this morning, when he succumbed to organic heart trouble. The deceased is survived by a wife and four children, two sons and two daughters, Messrs E. M. Green and John B. Green, Mrs. B. B. Hurst of this city, and Mrs. W. E. Turnbull, of Baltimore, Md. He also leaves a brother and sister, Mr. T. A. Green and Mrs. Susan Churchill, both of New Bern.
